Medical leaders join together for annual Non-Surgical Symposium

The Non-Surgical Symposium (NSS) is returning to Australia again on June 2nd and will draw together hundreds of medical practitioners from across the country. The NSS, which started in 2012, is co-hosted by the Cosmetic Physicians College of Australasia (CPCA) and the Australasian Society of Aesthetic Plastic Surgeons (ASAPS), and is the premier conference for non-surgical and minimally invasive cosmetic medicine in Australia, with attendance growing by around 20 per cent each year.

It takes place at the Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre from 2nd - 5th June.

International and local medical practitioners will gather for a four-day program to discuss medical advances and new technologies. Attendees can expect a range of seminars, workshops, anatomical dissections and in-depth discussions on concepts and practice in the non-surgical rejuvenation sector.

President of the CPCA, Dr Douglas Grose, will also be speaking at the event, alongside Dr Catherine Porter, cosmetic physician, and Dr Mary Dingley, cosmetic medicine practitioner, amongst other celebrated CPCA members.

Keynote speakers include Professor Dario Bertossi, a maxillofacial surgeon known for his innovative techniques; Dr Haideh Hirmand, an oculoplastic surgeon from New York and Dr Ashish Bhatia, an expert in dermatologic and cosmetic surgery.

This year's NSS will cover the entire spectrum of 'appearance' medicine, from injectables and skin care, to laser and light devices and non-surgical body contouring tools.

Dr Cath Porter, Sydney cosmetic physician and spokesperson for the CPCA said: "The NSS is a prestigious annual event that pulls together the top professionals in the industry and stimulates much discussion of new developments from around the globe. The symposium is a golden opportunity for practicing individuals and professional bodies to get to grips with developing technologies, new practices and changing regulation in the area of cosmetic medicine."
